In addition to the reporting of the Board's standing committees there will be two additional presentations:

Hammock's Board survey results and a lake and Cypress Glenn status update.

- This past spring the Hammock's Board distributed surveys soliciting your opinion on several 'quality of life' questions in the Hammocks. In July committees were formed to consolidate and evaluate the responses. The findings of four committees will be presented to the Board at the September 27th meeting. The subjects of the four presenting committees are pavers, paint colors, door options and beautification.
- The president of the RW Master HOA, Syble DiGirolamo, will provide an update on some of the drainage problems in and around the Hammocks and an update on Cypress Glenn.

Hammock's November Annual Meeting

The Hammock's Annual Member's Meeting will be held on Tuesday, November 20th at 6:30 PM in the RWGCC dining room. There will be two separate mailing prior to the November meeting. In the first mailing, among other items, there will be a 'Notice of intent to be a candidate for the Board' form. Four Board seats will be contested in November. If you think you would like to place your name in nomination as a Candidate for the Board, please complete the form and follow the filing instructions.

In the second mailing there will be, among other documents, a 'ballot' for you to 'officially' register your preferences on the 'quality of life' survey items. For any of the survey recommendations to be implemented a change to the 'covenants' will be required. Such a change requires a positive vote of two thirds of the Hammock's homeowners. Failure to vote is considered a 'no' vote. So, keep an eye out for the mailings from Argus Property Management, consider running for the Board and please complete the ballot on the survey proposals.

The Florida Department of Transportation is planning big changes for the I-75 and US 301 interchange. Plans for a new interchange and new bridges are in the works. Work on several surface intersections is scheduled for the fall of 2019. Money for the I-75 / US 301 project has been budgeted and is scheduled

to be completed sometime in 2022 or 2023. For now, work is progressing on SR 64 / I-75 interchange. When that is completed FDOT will focus on SR 70 / I-75. So, get ready, delays are coming to a stretch of highway near you!
