Eat Beat

Wanting to ensure our food critic stayed healthy and free of those pesky viruses The Happenings has been keeping the Eat Beat critic 'on the bench' for the last 18 months. But recently he has begun to venture out and he has discovered two new eateries in the area.

First there is the Ford Garage. No, not the one on 14 Street with the Bronco Sport and the Mach-E Mustang but the one at UTC with prime burgers and craft beers. All of the burgers (over a dozen) at The Ford Garage are half pound, USDA Black Angus beef burgers made fresh to order. If you are looking for a non-meat sandwich the Ford Garage offers a veggie burger substitute for any of their signature burgers. Looking for something to 'start your engine'? Try Edsel's Hot Pretzel, Jumbo Piston Onion Rings or Sesame Crusted Ahi Tuna. The 'mechanics' in the back can also provide great gluten free creations. They also offer a wide selection of craft beers and a long list of signature drinks like Lincoln Punch. The Oil Slick and Model Tea.

• Next is Cooper's Hawk. The Cooper's Hawk concept has four distinct components: upscale casual dining, full-service bar, a private dining room and a Napa-style tasting room and retail store. The menu is wide ranging and always presented with style by a very capable and knowledgeable wait staff. When you do come, come a little hungry because you will want to start with a cup (or bowl) of soup. Always on the menu is the crab and lobster bisque and the tortilla soup. A tough decision but I usually go with the tortilla soup. On this menu are nine beef, pork or chicken dishes. Without hesitation I can recommend Dana's Parmesan Crusted Chicken. Under 'seafood' you will find grouper, Jambalaya or blackened tuna; my wife usually sets her sights on the soy ginger Atlantic Salmon. The menu

also offers pasta and risotto dishes, burgers, salads and 'life balance' selections. And you know if they have a Napa-style tasting room they will have a great selection of wines.
